- **To vote:** completely darken the oval (●) to the left of your choice.
- Note the permitted number of choices directly below the title of each candidate office. Do not mark the ballot for more choices than allowed.
- If you mark the ballot for more choices than permitted, that contest or question will not be counted.
- **To vote for a write-in candidate:** completely darken the oval (●) to the left of the blank line and write in the candidate's name. Only votes cast for candidates who filed as write-in candidates can be counted.
- Do not write in a candidate's name if that person's name already is printed on the ballot for that same contest.
- **If you make a mistake or want to change your vote:** return your ballot to an election official and get a new ballot. You may ask for a new ballot up to two times.

### Sales and Use Tax (Continuation)

Wyandot County

### Proposed Bond Issue

Kenton City School District

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage

Shall bonds be issued by the Kenton City School District for the purpose of **constructing and improving school facilities and locally funded initiatives under a program of the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission; furnishing and equipping the same; and improving the sites thereof** in the principal amount of \$35,000,000, to be repaid annually over a maximum period of 37 years, and an annual levy of property taxes be made outside the ten-mill limitation, estimated by the county auditor to average over the repayment period of the bond issue 6.48 mills for each one dollar of tax valuation, which amounts to \$0.648 for each one hundred dollars of tax valuation, commencing in 2021, first due in calendar year 2022, to pay the annual debt charges on the bonds, and to pay debt charges on any notes issued in anticipation of those bonds?
